<b>1</b>	<p><b>Introduction</b></p> <p>T: What is meant by the 'Reading Age' of a text? (<i>Age at which a person should be able to read the text</i>)</p> <p>T: Why do we need to be able to estimate the Reading Age of a book?</p> <p>T: What can affect the 'Reading Age'? (<i>Size of text, length of sentences, length of words, etc.</i>)</p> <p>T: There are different ways of estimating the Reading Age; we'll look at three of the methods.</p>	<p>T: Teacher    P: Pupil</p> <p>Discussion with Ps on their understanding of what is meant by 'Reading Age'. (Preparation could be to ask Ps to bring in texts of different types, newspapers, etc.)</p> <p>Try to get Ps to decide the criteria that make a text easy or difficult to read.</p>																
<b>2</b>	<p><b>Practical Exercise</b></p> <p>T: Here are three formulae for finding the Reading Age. 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<b>3</b>	<p><b>Comparisons</b></p> <p>T: What conclusions can you make? (<i>Not very accurate formulae</i>)</p> <p>T: Can you design a better method?</p>	<p>Discussion with whole class; check their answers and discuss whether the concept of Reading Age really is valid.</p>																
<b>4</b>	<p><b>Design</b></p> <p>T: For homework, design your own method of assessing Reading Age, and test it out on 4 or 5 pieces of text.</p>
